BEST PRACTICE: I - Title of the Practice: Women Empowerment

The Context:

It is through community services rendered and extension activities undertaken by the college that the students as well as the stakeholders are oriented on various issues. It is the prime function of every educational institution to contribute to the welfare and the betterment of society at large. Obstacles faced/ Problems Encountered

Problems being faced and resources required in organizing these activities for development of girls' personality are as follows:

- Considering, the strength of the girl-students enrolled in the college, it was difficult to get all girl-students involved in these programs.
- Orientation programs need to be organized to increase their participation and involvement.
- Lack of awareness about the health, safety, rules, regulations and laws among the girl students.
- Existing educational infrastructure and quality of education is insufficient in addressing the issue of women empowerment.

Impact of the Practice/ Evidence of Success

The purpose of Women Empowerment programs organized in the college is to make the girlstudents physically, mentally and emotionally strong and sound. The programs organized resulted in the following:

- The activities benefit the students, especially the girls. There is increase in the admission of girl students.
- Programs on gender sensitization, physical well being, women safety workshops etc.
 help in the overall development of the necessary personal, social, and professional skills of girl students.
- Increase in the awareness of health related issues and their remedies among the girl students.
- Sharp increase in the girls' participation in sports and cultural activities of the college.
- Heightened awareness on sex education and gender sensitization
- Girl students learn about their rights and laws.

Resources Required

Teachers, support personnel, and college management all took part in the entire event in a sincere and active manner. An effort has been made to provide female students the same preference as male students while applying for various courses. There are numerous female professors working in all of the college's departments because the institution has a strong anti-discrimination policy. To ensure student safety, the college has installed surveillance cameras all across the campus. Another important requirement for the resources was the funding necessary to put in place a variety of programs and amenities for the girl students. A considerable sum of money from the management's corpus has to be set aside for this project.

BEST PRACTICE: II - Title of the Practice: Entrepreneurship Development

The Context:

The need of the hour is to build the student's mindset and foster entrepreneurship through improving entrepreneurial knowledge and skills through coaching and training programs. The Indian government has introduced a number of efforts to support entrepreneurs, including Startup Leadership Programs, Startup India efforts, and Seed Funds. The institution was awarded the RUSA grants for strengthening and growing the number of entrepreneurs by encouraging entrepreneurship among students. This method of entrepreneur development aids new businesses or enterprises in better attaining their objectives, boosting trade and the economy of the country. In line with this, the institution has set up a number of initiatives to support entrepreneurship and innovation on campus.

The Practice

Entrepreneurship Development Cell (ED) is another best practices run by the college to encourage and transform students into entrepreneurs. The college initiated its ED Cell with a view to encourage students to be self employers. The main objective is to create an environment in which individual become an entrepreneur. The ED cell of the college encourages students to become a job creator rather than job seekers. Students are motivated to encapsulate, accelerate their business idea and honed their skills and excel in various skills. During the year 2020-21, the entrepreneurships development cell has organized several activities like training programs, workshops, guest-lecturers etc. in collaboration with the different departments. The list of activities organized and beneficiaries of the programs is given below.

Obstacles faced/ Problems Encountered

- During the Covid pandemic the students participation in the activities was in online mode
- For promotion of entrepreneurships organization of hand on workshops, training programs and live demonstration required.

Evidence of success

During the academic year 2021-2022 total 42 activities were organized for the students and approximately 1243 students participated in the activities. The college conducted special trainings like Language Programming, Machine learning, Cyber Securities, Organic Farming, Digital marketing, LED bulb manufacturing etc. Many students realized the huge opportunities in starting a business and start thinking on this line. Some of the students (09) from B.Voc. started their small scale business. 03 three students participated in the startup program "Innovations" organized by Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.
