On 12/10/2023, the National Service Scheme (NSS) organized a successful blood donation camp at Baramati. The initiative aimed to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation and to encourage community participation in saving lives. 




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

The annual Ganesh Chaturthi festival is a significant cultural and religious event in India, marked by the installation and worship of Lord Ganesha idols. However, the traditional practice of Ganesh Visarjan (immersion of idols in water bodies) has raised environmental concerns due to the pollution caused by non-biodegradable materials used in idols and decorations. To promote eco-friendly practices, the National Service Scheme (NSS) students took an active part in the Ganesh Visarjan process, focusing on environmental awareness and sustainability. This initiative aimed to educate the public about the environmental impact of the Visarjan and encourage the use of eco-friendly materials, while also assisting in the safe and responsible immersion of idols. Total 26 NSS Volunteers participated for the event.

The key objectives of the NSS students' involvement in the Ganesh Visarjan for environmental awareness were:Awareness Campaigns: Before the Visarjan day, NSS volunteers conducted door-to-door campaigns and distributed leaflets about the environmental impact of plaster of Paris (PoP) idols, chemical paints, and synthetic decorations. They encouraged households to opt for eco-friendly clay idols and natural decorations like leaves, flowers, and organic colours.Eco-Friendly Idol Promotion: NSS students partnered with local artisans and environmental NGOs to promote and distribute eco-friendly Ganesha idols. These idols were made from clay and natural materials that dissolve easily in water without harming aquatic life. Designated Immersion Points: On the day of Ganesh Visarjan, NSS students assisted in setting up and managing artificial immersion tanks and ponds. These tanks were set up by local authorities to reduce pollution in natural water bodies. NSS volunteers helped devotees immerse their idols in these



tanks and explained how this practice helps in preserving the environment. Post-Visarjan Clean-Up: After the immersion process, NSS students conducted clean-up drives at the immersion points to remove waste materials such as flowers, plastics, and decorations. This activity ensured that the areas remained clean and that non-biodegradable waste did not enter water bodies.

The participation of NSS students in the Ganesh Visarjan process to promote environmental awareness was a significant step towards a greener and more sustainable celebration of the Ganesh festival. Through their efforts, they successfully raised awareness about the environmental impact of traditional Visarjan practices, promoted the use of eco-friendly materials, and helped protect water bodies from pollution. The initiative showcased the important role that youth and educational institutions can play in addressing environmental challenges and fostering a culture of sustainability. By combining tradition with environmental responsibility, the NSS students helped ensure that the festival was not only a celebration of faith but also a commitment to protecting nature for future generations.

On 22/07/2023 the NSS Unit of Tuljaram Chaturchand College of Arts Science and Commerce in association with Utkarsha Foundation, Mumbai organized a distribution drive during the Pandharpur Waari pilgrimage, focusing on the provision of essential items such as water bottles and bags to pilgrims. The initiative aimed to support the pilgrims on their spiritual journey by ensuring they remained hydrated and had sturdy bags for carrying essentials, reflecting the core values of community service and social responsibility upheld by both the NSS and Utkarsha Foundation. The primary goal of the distribution drive was to assist pilgrims by providing reusable water bottles to promote hydration and reduce plastic waste, and durable bags for carrying personal belongings during their long walk. This initiative not only aimed to cater to the immediate needs of the pilgrims but also to spread awareness on sustainable practices by discouraging the use of disposable plastic bottles. There were 150 NSS volunteers participated.

The distribution drive was strategically conducted at multiple points along the pilgrimage route where pilgrims took rest. The program saw active participation from over 50 NSS volunteers and representatives from Utkarsha Foundation, who worked hand-in-hand to ensure smooth execution. The activities included:Water Bottle Distribution: Volunteers distributed 1,000 reusable water bottles to the pilgrims, ensuring that they had access to clean drinking water throughout their journey. The bottles were made from eco-friendly, BPA-free materials, promoting both health and environmental sustainability. Volunteers also educated the pilgrims on the importance of staying hydrated, especially under the hot



weather conditions.Bag Distribution: Around 500 sturdy cloth bags were distributed to the pilgrims to help them carry their personal belongings more conveniently. These bags were made from durable, eco-friendly materials, ensuring they could be reused for future journeys. The initiative also encouraged the reduction of plastic bag usage, aligning with the broader environmental goals of both the NSS and Utkarsha Foundation.Awareness Campaign: Along with the distribution of water bottles and bags, an awareness campaign was conducted where volunteers spoke to the pilgrims about the importance of reducing single-use plastic during the pilgrimage. Pamphlets were distributed containing information on sustainable living practices, highlighting how small changes, like using reusable bottles and bags, can significantly reduce environmental impactThe distribution drive was met with overwhelming appreciation from the pilgrims, who expressed gratitude for the thoughtful gesture. The initiative served over 1,000 pilgrims, and the reusable bottles and bags were well received. The program also contributed to the reduction of plastic waste during the pilgrimage, as the use of reusable water bottles replaced the common practice of buying plastic water bottles along the route. The NSS volunteers gained valuable experience in community service, team coordination, and environmental advocacy. The event also strengthened the collaboration between the college NSS unit and Utkarsha Foundation, Mumbai, paving the way for future joint initiatives.

but also contributed to a cleaner, greener pilgrimage experience. The initiative has set a positive example for future events and laid the foundation for continued service to society and the environment.



In an effort to promote democratic participation and ensure that all eligible citizens have the opportunity to vote, a New Voter Registration Camp was organized by the National Service Scheme (NSS) in collaboration with the local Tehsil Office. 5. Ease of Access: By bringing voter registration services directly to the community, the camp removed the barriers that many rural and marginalized individuals face when accessing government services.


