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Anekant Education Society

Anekant Education Society established in 1961 with the inspiration and blessings of the late Saint Samantbhadra Maharaj and, under the guidance of late Hon. Shri. Fulchand Gandhi, Former Education Minister of Hyderabad state. The Jain philosophy 'Siddhiranekantant' is the motto and 'Anekantwad' is a preamble of society. Anekant Education Society started a college named as Baramati College, Baramati in June 1962, with 112 students and 12 teachers. Later, it was renamed as Tuljaram Chaturchand College, presently boasts over 10,000 students from different disciplines. Moreover, the society runs another degree college named Jaysingpur College in Jaysingpur, Dist. Kolhapur M.S. Furthermore, it extended its endeavors by establishing Anekant Institute of Management Studies (AIMS), Anekant English Medium School, Baramati and College of Pharmacy from the academic year 2024-2025.

Anekant Education Society is run by Jain community and has been catering to the educational needs of students belonging to different strata of society. Facilities provided in the Girls 'Hostel:

- 1. The hostel provides sturdy iron cots, but students are required to bring their own mattresses.
- 2. Each room is allotted a cupboard, a fan, and tube light.
- 3. There are common bathrooms with four units per floor, and common toilets. Additionally, there are sinks for washing hands and faces, clothes drying stands, and large dustbins on every floor.
- 4. There are two cafeterias and dining halls for the girls. (Only vegetarian food)
- 5. A solar-water heating system and an electric heat pump for hot water is provided to the girl students.
- 6. The hostel also has an electric incinerator machine and a vending machine.
- 7. A cycle stand is available to park cycles for girl students.
- 8. A visiting doctor is available in case of medical emergency. When girls are ill and need to be admitted to the hospital, they are accompanied by the female rector.
- 9. The hostel provides a gym facility, a prayer hall, and a medical checkup room.
- 10. The female rector resides within the hostel.
- 11. The hostel, being located on the college campus, is safe and secure with a boundary wall.
- 12. An attendant during the day and night, and a security guard take care of the additional security of the girls' hostel.
- 13. The hostel is situated in a scenic environment and offers newspaper facilities, a TV room, and CCTV cameras for surveillance.

B) Boys' Hostel

Swatantrya Sainik Galinde Bandhu Boys' Hostel offers various facilities. The boys' hostel has been in operation since 1963-64, initially providing 30 rooms with accommodation for 120 boys. After some years, an additional floor was constructed, resulting in a total of 60 rooms (including the ground floor and the first floor), providing accommodation for 250 boys. This hostel remained operational until 2017-18. However, due to its aging structure, it was decided to demolish the old boys' hostel and build a new one. Consequently, the boys 'hostel was not available for accommodation from the academic year 2018-19 to 2021-22 due to construction. Once the new boys' hostel was completed, it became available for accommodation for boys from the academic year 2022-23. The new Boys' hostel is a three-story building with a total capacity of 315 boys, comprising a total of 105 rooms.

Boys' Hostel (MBA Campus)

The MBA college campus also has a boys' hostel facility, with two hostels located within the campus grounds. Each hostel accommodates 60 students, providing a total of 120 students with a place to stay across both hostels. A mess facility is also available here. These hostels are made available for stay of Students of Tuljaram Chaturchand College, Baramati also.

Facilities provided in the Boys' Hostel:

- 2. Each room is allotted a cupboard, a fan, Study table with Chair and tube light.
- 3. A solar-water heating system and an electric heat pump for hot water are provided to the students.

Cancellation of Hostel Admission and Hostel Deposit & Refund:

A Student is required to inform in writing for cancellation of hostel admission and refund of hostel fees. The rates of refund of hostel fee in the event of cancellation of hostel admission will be as per schedule given below. Student is required to submit the hostel leaving from indicating the date of leaving the hostel. The original challan of payment of hostel fee should be attached to the hostel leaving from.

If any Student (Boys or Girl) cancels his / her Hostel Admission, Hostel fee is refunded as per following Rules

Code of Conduct/ Rules and Regulations for Boys & Girls:

- 1. Each and every student residing in the hostel is responsible for maintaining all furniture, electrical facilities, and doors in good order in the room. A fine of Rs. 500/- will be imposed on anyone who leaves the fans, lights, or taps on when leaving the room.
- 2. If there is any damage to items in the room or the hostel, it must be reported and restitution must be made. No student should attempt any repairs on their own.
- 3. Students should not use any appliances such as induction cookers, hot plates, electric iron, etc. In case of the use of such electronic appliances, the same will be forfeited.
- 4. Girl's students are not allowed to leave the hostel after 7:00 pm and before 6:30 am. Boys are not allowed to leave hostel after 9.30 pm.
- 5. In the evening, students must be present for the attendance that would be taken at 7:30 pm and 9:30 pm.
- 6. The students are not allowed to enter in any other room or common areas without permission post 9:30 pm. Local guardian/friends/guests/visitors/pets are not allowed to stay in hostel rooms. Local guardian/parents/visitors to the hostel are only allowed to visit their pupils in the hostel during appointed hours with the permission from rector.
- 7. Students shall not play audio/video devices in the hostel premises or mess that may cause a nuisance to the fellow students.
- 8. If any student wishes to travel out of town, he or she must fill out a specified form, get it signed by a local guardian, and obtain permission from the hostel's warden before leaving. No student can leave without following the above-mentioned procedure, and repeated travel is not allowed.
- 9. Before going home after the exam, the student must fill out and submit the same form, and the signature of the local guardian is also required.
- 10. A student must take prior permission from the rector if he or she wants to stay in the hostel during summer or Diwali vacation.









- 11. Without prior permission from the rector and hotel authorities, students are not allowed to organize any program in the hostel premises.
- 12. The students should not keep any valuable articles, ornaments or cash in their rooms or can keep at their own risk. Please note that the institution and hostel staff are not responsible for any theft or loss of valuable items.
- 13. Cooking food in the rooms is strictly prohibited and defaulters will be blacklisted.

 All the students are required to use water carefully and not wash utensils in the basin or washroom.
- 14. Non-vegetarian food is strictly not allowed on college campus, including hostel premises. If any student is found violating this rule would be expelled and his/her admission would be cancelled immediately.
- 15. Students must vacate their hostel room and clear out their belongings within three days after the end of the term or board examination.
- 16. Admission to the hostel is granted for two terms or one academic year. Admission for the second term is only granted after payment of the hostel fee. No extension will be given for hostel fee payment deadlines. The decision to allow a student to stay in the hostel or not will be based on their behaviour in the hostel.
- 17. The committee has the right to expel any student exhibiting indiscipline from the hostel at any time.
- 18. Every student in the hostel will undergo a medical examination, and a separate fee will be required for this. The committee has the right to refuse admission to anyone with a contagious disease.
- 19. Upon vacating the hostel, all items provided at the time of admission must be returned to the hostel warden/rector.
- 20. It is the responsibility of every student to keep their room and bathroom clean.
- 21. If any student falls ill, they must immediately inform the hostel warden or rector.
- 22. The hostel warden and committee have the right to inspect a student's mobile phone on specific occasions.
- 23. Students residing in the hostel must have their food in the hostel mess.





- 24. The rules of the mess are determined by the mess managers, and the students must adhere to them. The college only decides on the meal schedule and menu card. Other rules are set by the independent mess operators.
- 25. The college or institute will not be liable in any way for any harm or danger a student might cause to themselves while on campus or in the hostel during the academic period.
- 26. All girl students residing in the hostel must be present by 7:00 pm. After 7:00 pm, entry to the hostel will not be allowed.
- 27. Daily attendance at the prayer hall at the designated prayer time is mandatory. (for Girls Only)
- 28. Visitors must sign the register upon arrival at the hostel. Visiting hours for parents/guardians is from 9:00 to 11:00am and from 4:30 to 6:00 pm. Girl students must not spend excessive time talking with visitors.
- 29. Guests, relatives, and friends are not allowed in the hostel, and students are not permitted to let them stay overnight.

C) Working Women Hostel

There is a hostel facility available for working women at Tuljaram Chaturchand College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Baramati. The C wing of Hostel Campus houses this facility. Women working outside government offices, banks, schools, and colleges, other organizations can stay in the Working women's hostel. Even female Ph.D. researchers can reside in the working women's hostel. The annual fee of working women hostel is ₹20,100, and it can be paid in installments of ₹10,000 per term. The payment system is online. To stay in the hostel, working women need to provide employment certificates from the organization/institute where they work. This hostel has been available since 1994, and three women can stay in one room. Facilities like mess, hot water for bathing, drinking water, and CCTV cameras are available.
