viii. Compilation by IQAC:


IQAC compiles all suggestions and action plans, ensuring a structured approach to implementing changes.






The chart reveals that 35% of respondents rated the teaching methods and techniques as "Excellent", showing strong approval. 32% rated them as "Very Good", meaning



Over two-thirds of people (67%) are very satisfied with teaching methods and techniques.








The Chart Reveals that the 65% rated access to learning resources as "Excellent" and "Very Good," indicating strong approval of the available resources.





Analysis of Teacher Feedback on Curriculum










The chart shows that 98% of respondents rated the amalgamation of theory and practical as "Very Good" and "Excellent," while 1% rated it as "Good".



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

Analysis of Alumni's Feedback on Curriculum






The data reveals that 52% rated the support provided for higher studies and career planning as "Excellent," and 31% as "Very Good," highlighting strong approval of the guidance offered.






The chart indicates that 84% rated the regularity of syllabus updation as "Good" With 11% rating "Average", suggesting effective and timely updates to the syllabus.




The data shows that 83% rated the effectiveness of teaching-learning methods as "Excellent" and "Very Good," reflecting high satisfaction with teaching learning methods.






Analysis of Employer's Feedback on Curriculum




The chart shows that 50% of respondents rated the relevance of course content






